Royko memorabilia on display

Mike Royko memorabilia will be on display at the Newberry Library from Tuesday through Jan. 14. The library says the items saved by the legendary Chicago newspaperman and donated last summer by his widow, Judy, are part of a bigger collection. The exhibit will include an essay Royko wrote when he applied for a job with the City News Bureau in 1959. Also on display will be his Rolodex and the 1972 letter confirming Royko had received that year's Pulitzer Prize for commentary. The Royko donation includes items dated from 1945 to 1997. The material is available for scholarly research at the library, 60 W. Walton.
